



The Lilly Pilly is one of the most popular native plants in Australia today, particularly for hedging. It is grown for its attractive foliage and berries. Lilly Pillies are evergreen rainforest plants with glossy green leaves. Many varieties have flushes of glossy colourful new growth, ranging from brilliant pink to a red-brown.

<u>Care:</u> Will grow in most garden soils preferably fertile and moist, in full to partial sun. For best results enrich soil with compost and mulch well.

<u>Planting ideas and uses</u>: Excellent hedging plant that can be trimmed to form shapes. If left untrimmed they grow up to 15m tall. Great in decorative tubs or pots. Berries are edible fresh or cooked as jam.

Flowering Season: In spring to early Summer most Lilly Pillies have fluffy white or greenish fragrant flowers followed by long lasting red, purple or whitish berries or fruits. The fruits will normally fall in late autumn if not eaten by birds, but clean up is reasonably quick and simple.
